## ADRIAN POP

**Adrian Pop** graduated from the Department of History and Philosophy of the Babeş-Bolyai University in Cluj-Napoca, Romania. He holds an MA in Political Sciences from the Central European University in Budapest, Hungary and a PhD in History from the Babeş-Bolyai University in Cluj-Napoca.

He is Professor and Head of the Political Sciences Department at „Dimitrie Cantemir” University in Bucharest, Romania and an Associate Professor with several other universities in the capital city of Romania. He was Deputy Director of the Institute for Political Studies of Defence and Military History in Bucharest, Senior Visiting Fulbright Scholar with the Department of Government and Politics at the University of Maryland, College Park, U.S.A., and an International Research Fellow with the NATO Defence College in Rome, as well as the editor-in-chief of *Romanian Review of International Studies*.

As expert, he had numerous collaborations with renowned institutes, research centres and foundations in Europe and America, among which the Centre for Applied Politics Research in München and Bertelsmann Foundation in Gütersloh, Germany, the Centre for European Security Studies in Groningen, The Netherlands, the Military Centre for Strategic Studies in Rome, Italy, the Institute for Regional and International Studies (IRIS) in Sofia, Bulgaria, the International Research and Exchanges Board (IREX), the German Marshall Fund of the United States, and the American Council for the United Nations University in Washington, DC, U.S.A.

Professor Pop is a member of the Scientific Board of the Institute for the Memory of Romanian Exile. He was also a member of the Advisory Board of “Central European Issues” and “History’s Files” journals.

In addition, he is a guest lecturer for the summer courses on Romanian culture and civilization organized for foreigners by the Romanian Cultural Institute.

He has been nominated as an *International Educator of the Year 2004* by the International Biographical Centre in Cambridge, England. His biography is included also in the *Contemporary Who's Who* (2003 Edition) and *The Contemporary Who's Who of Professionals* (2004/2005 Edition) published by the American Biographical Institute in Raleigh, U.S.A.

His academic works published both in Romania and abroad are circumscribed to the topics of Cold War history, geopolitics, and European and Euro-Atlantic security and integration. He also contributed chapters to several books on Cold War history, post-Cold War international relations and security issues and studies and articles to various Romanian and English language journals.

Professor Pop is the author of several books, including *Geopolitica* [Geopolitics] (București, 2003), *Strategii de integrare europeană* [Strategies of European Integration] (București, 2003), *Tentația tranziției. O istorie a prăbușirii comunismului în Europa de Est* [The Temptation of Transition: A History of the Breakdown of Communism in Eastern Europe] (București, 2002), *At the Crossroads of Interlocking Subregional Arrangements: Romania's Pivotal Role in East Central Europe*, NDC Monograph Series (Rome: NATO Defence College, Fall 1999), and *O fenomenologie a gândirii istorice românești. Teoria și filosofia istoriei de la Hașdeu și Xenopol la Iorga și Blaga* [A Phenomenology of Romanian Historical Thinking: The Theory and Philosophy of History from Hașdeu and Xenopol to Iorga and Blaga] (București, 1999).
